WHAT IS IT?



INTRODUCTION

The <u>High Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development</u> (HLPF) is the central United Nations platform for the follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at the global level.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a set of 17 commitments made by every government represented at the United Nations. They aim to end extreme poverty, inequality, and climate change by 2030. Visit the <u>Global</u> <u>Goals website</u> to learn more and take action.

VOLUNTARY NATIONAL REVIEWS

At the HLPF, government leaders report on their national progress toward achievement of the SDGs. These voluntary national reviews (VNRs) aim to facilitate the sharing of experiences, including successes, challenges and lessons learned, with a view to accelerating the implementation of the 2030 Agenda. As governments report to this global forum on a voluntary basis, not every government presents a report each year. Check the <u>VNR webpage</u> to find out if your government will be presenting at this year's HLPF, and on this webpage you can also access a written version of your government's report.

OUTCOME

The HLPF will negotiate and adopt what is called a Ministerial Declaration. This Ministerial Declaration is meant to assess progress on, and challenges to, achieving the SDGs, as well as highlight concrete actions that will accelerate implementation efforts. THEME

The 2022 HLPF theme is "Building back better from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) while advancing the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development." It will assess the different impacts the pandemic across the SDGs and address the integrated, indivisible, and interlinked nature of the Goals.

FOCUS SDGS

Each year, the UN selects particular SDGs to focus on for a more in-depth review. The 2022 HLPF will focus on the following SDGs: 4 quality education, 5 gender equality, 14 healthy aquatic ecosystems, 15 healthy terrestrial ecosystems, and 17 partnerships for the Goals. Education is an essential building block that will allow many other SDGs to be achieved. With access to quality education, people can break from the cycle of poverty. Healthy Aquatic Ecosystems:

The ocean is essential to our existence. It generates the oxygen we breathe; regulates global climate; supplies livelihoods; and provides the water, energy, and food we need to survive. Billions of humans, animals, and plants rely on a healthy ocean, and we have exploited and caused tremendous damage to this resource. We must chart a sustainable path to recovery, to protect the ocean and our planet.

Healthy Terrestrial Ecosystems: Forests cover nearly 31% of our Earth's land area. They sustain life in many ways – from the air we breathe, to the water we drink, to the food we eat – and they provide vital habitats for more than 80% of all terrestrial species of animals, plants and insects. However, land degradation is undermining the well-being of approximately 3.2 billion people, driving species to extinction, and intensifying climate change. Forests posses the potential to play a significant role in climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction strategies as they can deliver benefits that will increase the resilience of both people and planet.

VNR Presentations from Governments

VOLUNTARY REPORTS ON THE SDGS

From 11-15 July, the HLPF will engage in VNR presentations from <u>44 countries</u>. 11 countries will present for the 1st time, 28 for the <u>2nd time</u>, 3 for the <u>3rd time</u>, and 2 countries for the <u>4th</u> time. First-time presenters will have 15 minutes for their presentation and 20 minutes for questions and answers (Q&A). They will choose whether to present in an individual format or in a panel with other countries. The second, third and fourth timers will have 10 minutes for their presentation and around 15 minutes for Q&A and will present in a panel format. During the allotted time for Q&A, there will be an opportunity for a limited number of questions and comments by participating States and stakeholders. At the end of the session, the VNR countries will be given a few minutes to respond to the interventions.

Series of showcases of Catholic Religious and their partners' perspectives on progress and good practices toward SDGs 4, 5, 14, 15, and 17


