

Programme for Religious NGO Digital Delegates to the 2023 High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development

Participants: Religious Sisters, Brothers, priests, associates, and partners in mission who are based in, or have significant personal experience in, <u>countries who will present VNR reports to the 2023 HLPF</u>

Goals for participants:

- Build understanding of the role of the Religious voice in the UN system and global efforts toward just, sustainable development
- Establish or deepen understanding of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the related High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF) and Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) on progress toward achieving them
- Get support from UN representatives of Religious NGOs toward participation in your national and global conversations on SDG progress
- Meet and learn from other women and men Religious and their partners who are seeking to implement and monitor SDGs in your region and other parts of the world

Format:

- Series of live, online gatherings to provide orientation and facilitate preparatory research and engagement of members between January and July 2023
 - Global gatherings (for all participants): 30 January, 27 February, 11 April, 22 May, 3 July, and 31 July
 - Regional gatherings:
 - 6-10 February (regional meet and greet)
 - March (follow UN Regional Fora on Sustainable Development)
 - 19-30 June: regional discussion of national government's reports
 - exact dates to be determined by those in each group
- Independent study/reflection activities to be completed between online gatherings
- "JCoR SDG Lab" during the HLPF (11-15 July 2023)
 - Platform featuring a series of open Zoom calls where members and partners can meet to share good practices/knowledge/expertise on various SDGs under review
 - time slots for live discussions to be focused on each of the SDGs under review at 2023 HLPF: 6 (water and sanitation), 7 (clean energy), 9 (innovation & infrastructure), 11 (sustainable urban housing, waste management, etc.), 17 (partnerships for the SDGs)

Commitment required for participation:

- Attendance at least 5 online gatherings
- Viewing recordings of any gathering a participant is unable to attend live
- Participation in at least one session of the "JCoR SDG Lab" during the HLPF in July
- Completion of all independent study/reflection activities between gatherings
- Effort to make contact with a national civil society network that is monitoring SDG implementation in the participant's country

Topics to be covered in online gatherings:

- 30 January 2023:
 - What is the Justice Coalition of Religious (JCoR)?
 - What are the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)?
 - What is the role of Religious congregations in the UN system and the SDGs?
- 6-10 February 2023:
 - o Meeting others with your region and learning about their personal areas of ministry and experience
 - Exact date and time to be selected by members from each region
- 27 February 2023:
 - What is the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF)?
 - What are Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs)?
 - How can we, members of civil society, participate in the VNR process and in the HLPF?
- March 2023 regional gathering:
 - What are key themes of our respective nations' input to the HLPF?
 - What insights or concepts would we wish to reinforce? What would we add?
- 11 April 2023:
 - To which of the priority SDGs does each of us feel called to focus (and possibly speak about) during the JCoR SDG Lab?
 - What specific projects and ministries are we involved in that contribute to the priority SDGs for the 2023 HLPF?
- 22 May 2023:
 - How can we reflect on reports of governments and civil society to previous HLPF sessions?
 - What tasks do we need to complete by the end of June to prepare for our participation in the HLPF?
- 19-30 June 2023 regional gathering:
 - What are our responses to the most recent VNR presented by our respective governments?
 - What are our responses to the most recent VNR report developed by a civil society network in our respective countries?
 - Who will present key ideas from each country in our regional group?
- 3 July 2023:
 - What key ideas and reflections were shared during our June regional gatherings?
 - Who will represent their country by presenting key ideas/reflections on SDG progress during the JCoR SDG Lab?
 - Who will represent their country and congregation by presenting a good practice in SDG implementation during the JCoR SDG Lab?
- 31 July 2023:
 - What were our impressions of the 2023 HLPF?
 - How do we intend to take the lessons of this process forward?
 - What support from JCoR or our congregations would helpful to us as we continue to implement and monitor SDGs in our countries?
