We work toward this goal by coordinating national, regional, and global efforts of Religious to call on political leaders to take action for a just, equitable, and rights-based implementation of the **Sustainable Development Goals** (SDGs), the United Nations' Agenda for 2015-2030.

We hope these pages will help empower you join us in this mission!




































Introduction

The <u>High Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development</u> (HLPF) is the central United Nations platform for the follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at the global level. During the HLPF, UN Member States and civil society organizations are invited to report progress towards the SDGs. This year's HLPF is particularly significant because it serves as the lead up to the <u>SDG Summit</u> (18–19 September 2023), which marks the mid-point of the commitment to achieve the 2030 Agenda. Therefore, the Forum will emphasize the opportunity to share information about new and ambitious initiatives and actions to accelerate progress on sustainable development.

Thematic Focus

The 2023 HLPF theme is "Accelerating the recovery from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development at all levels."

Sustainable Development Goals

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a set of 17 commitments made by every government represented at the United Nations. They aim to end extreme poverty and inequality, protect the planet, and ensure all people enjoy prosperity and peace by 2030. Focus SDGs

Each year, the UN selects particular SDGs to focus on for a more in-depth review. The 2023 HLPF will focus on the following SDGs: 6 clean water and sanitation, 7 affordable and clean energy, 9 industry, innovation and infrastructure, 11 sustainable cites and communities, and 17 partnerships for the goals. Outcome

The President of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) will prepare a summary of the key messages that emerge from the 2023 HLPF discussions. This summary will be followed up by a negotiated <u>political declaration</u> to be adopted during the SDG Summit. The current <u>draft</u> of the political declaration highlights shared determination, progress, remaining gaps and challenges, and the call to action to accelerate progress towards sustainable development.



Clean Water and Sanitation

Ensure access to water and sanitation for all

To achieve Goal 6, governments have agreed to:

- Ensure all people have access to safe water
- Ensure all people have access to sanitation (such as safe sewage disposal and proper waste management)
- Ensure all people have access to public education on healthy hygiene habits
- Monitor water quality and prevent chemicals and contaminants from being discarded into water sources
- Improve water use and reutilization
- Protect and restore water-related ecosystems, including mountains, forests, wetlands, rivers, aquifers and lakes



Affordable and Clean Energy

Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy

To achieve Goal 7, governments have agreed to:

- Ensure access for all people to affordable, reliable, and modern energy services through improved technology and new infrastructure
- Promote energy efficiency and develop technology that wastes less energy
- Increase the use of renewable energy sources
- Work together to research and develop renewable and clean energy resources



Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure

Build resilient infrastructure, promote sustainable industrialization and foster innovation

To achieve Goal 9, governments have agreed to:

- Ensure all people have access to the internet and new technologies
- Develop sustainable and resilient infrastructure to support economic development and human well-being
- Allocate resources for research to improve technology
- Provide small businesses with access to credit and technical support for their development
- Ensure that companies promote sustainable development and do not harm the environment



Sustainable Cities and Communities

Make cities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable

To achieve Goal 11, governments have agreed to:

- Ensure all people have access to quality, safe housing and basic services
- Provide safe and organized transportation
- Engage communities in discussions and planning for improvement of their cities
- Increase resilience to disasters
- Ensure monitoring of waste management and air quality
- Prepare communities to manage their resources properly and to tackle climate change



Partnerships for the Goals

Revitalize the global partnership for sustainable development

To achieve Goal 17, governments have agreed to:

- Ensure all countries have met the SDGs by 2030
- Ensure each country allocates resources to achieve the SDGs, and developed countries should commit to supporting implementation of the Goals in less–developed countries.
- Engage with organizations that have been working for many years on concerns that relate to the SDGs. because their experience and support is vital to success
- Ensure governments improve their data and statistics management to be able to assess progress toward achievement of the SDGs

Introduction to VNRs

At the HLPF, government leaders report on their national progress toward achievement of the sustainable development goals. These reports, called voluntary national reviews (VNRs), aim to facilitate the sharing of experiences, including successes, challenges and lessons learned, with a view to accelerating the implementation of the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development.
