We work toward this goal by coordinating national, regional, and global efforts of Religious to call on political leaders to take action for a just, equitable, and rights-based implementation of the <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u> (SDGs), the United Nations' Agenda for 2015-2030.

What is the opening of the General Assembly?

The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) is the **main policy-making body of the United Nations** (UN), composed of representatives from each of the 193 UN Member States. It serves as a platform for discussion of specific issues that culminate in the voting on and adoption of resolutions.

The UNGA annual session commences in September, welcoming heads of state and government to the UN Headquarters in New York for the General Debate, a central focus of every session. The General Debate provides a space for UN Member States to deliver statements and present topics of significance in front of a world audience.

This year marks the **78th session of the UNGA** (UNGA78), which will officially open on Monday, 18 September. The first day of the high-level General Debate will begin on Tuesday, 19 September and continue through Monday, 26 September. Featured events at this year's UNGA also include SDG Action Weekend, the SDG Summit, and the Climate Ambition Summit.

The theme of this year's annual session is "Rebuilding trust and reigniting global solidarity: Accelerating action on the 2030 Agenda and its Sustainable Development Goals towards peace, prosperity, progress and sustainability for all." Accordingly, UNGA78 presents an opportunity for world leaders to come together to **commit to collective action to accelerate progress on creating a more sustainable and just future for all** - leaving no one behind.

From 1 September 2023, no new passes will be approved or issued for representatives of NGOs in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council for the duration of the high-level week of the General **Assembly. Access to United Nations** premises will be granted with valid **United Nations grounds passes** only until 15 September 2023. From 18 to 29 September 2023, the use of annual and temporary grounds passes for NGOs in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council to enter the Headquarters complex will be suspended.

Instructions for in-person participation

ACCESS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

A limited number of special passes for the General Assembly will be distributed daily from 18 to 26 September by the NGO Branch of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs, on a first-come, first-served basis at the corner of Second Avenue and 46th Street from 9 to 10 a.m. and from 2 to 3 p.m. for participation on the same day. Tickets will be distributed upon presentation of a valid UN grounds pass. Owing to the limited number of passes available, and in order to provide equal opportunity to all NGOs in consultative status to attend the sessions, special half-day passes will be distributed to one representative of each NGO to attend either the morning session or the afternoon session of the general debate, but not both. In other words, NGOs participating in the morning session cannot participate in the afternoon session.

ACCESS TO SPECIAL EVENTS

Members of civil society and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) whose participation has been approved through an online registration process to attend UN high-level meetings or other UN events will be required to be in possession of a government-issued photo identification and a Special Event Ticket (indicating the specific meeting, date and time) at all times. The issuance of Special Event Tickets is the responsibility of the United Nations sponsoring office and/or Permanent Mission. Non-United Nations guests will require a sponsoring office or delegation staff member escort from the access point on Second Avenue and 46th Street to the meeting or event location.

The Action Weekend provides a space for participants to develop fundamental messages to inform the proceedings of the SDG Summit.

SDG Summit

18-19 SEPTEMBER

The <u>SDG Summit</u> gathers governments and Heads of State with the central aims of generating renewed enthusiasm for the 2030 Agenda and catalyzing action to accelerate progress on the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. The outcome of the Summit will be a negotiated political declaration.

High-level Dialogue on Finance for Development

20 SEPTEMBER

The <u>High-level Dialogue on Finance for</u> <u>Development</u> assembles governments, civil society, the private sector, and financial institutions to announce new financial commitments and mobilization of resources to accelerate progress on the 2030 Agenda.

Climate Ambition Summit

21 SEPTEMBER

The <u>Climate Ambition Summit</u> convenes leaders, across governments, businesses, financial institutions, and civil society. It calls on each of these participants to present "credible, serious and new climate action and naturebased solutions" to respond to the urgency of the climate crisis.
