

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Affordable Healthcare Services,

The RSHMLCCC is committed to providing affordable healthcare services to the deprived communities in Chinhoyi by:

- Offering a sliding scale payment system-where cost of services is determined by the individual's/ family's financial capabilities.
- Collaborating with local government and non-profit organizations to secure funding and subsidies, which allows further reduction of the cost of healthcare for the most vulnerable individuals.

 Bringing PHC and other specialized care to the community, at affordable prices and ensuring that high-quality healthcare is accessible and affordable, the clinic is directly contributing to the financial stability and overall well-being of the community

SUPPLEMENTARY MILK PROVISION FOR CHILDREN:



Supplementary Milk Provision for Children:

The clinic has identified malnutrition as a significant contributing factor to the cycle of poverty in the local community. Through the supplementary milk program, they provide a daily serving of nutrient-rich milk to children under the age of 2 who are at risk of or experiencing malnutrition. A total of 40 infants were enrolled in this 6 month program.

This program is implemented in collaboration with community centers, ensuring widespread reach and accessibility.

The clinic's medical team closely monitors the children's growth and development, making adjustments to the program as needed.

By addressing the nutritional needs of children, the clinic is laying the foundation for their physical and cognitive development, which is crucial for breaking the cycle of poverty.

MEAL PROVISION FOR STAFF:



Meal Provision for Staff:

The clinic recognizes that the financial stability of its staff is directly linked to the organization's ability to provide high-quality healthcare services.

We offer a subsidized daily meal program for 13 clinic staff, including doctors, nurses, administrative personnel, and support staff. This includes, breakfast and Lunch.

The meals are prepared on-site by the clinic's kitchen, using locally sourced and nutritious ingredients.

This initiative not only supports the physical wellbeing of the staff but also contributes to their financial security, as it reduces the burden of providing for their own meals.

By investing in the welfare of its workforce, the clinic is ensuring the long-term sustainability and effectiveness of its healthcare services.



Volunteer Program

The clinic has established a comprehensive volunteer education program to empower members of the local community.

The program covers a wide range health courses.

Currently the funding that the clinic got has enrolled for medicine, pharmacy technician and the other one for acquiring basic o-level education These trained volunteers vow to come back after acquiring their degrees to give back to the clinic through provision of services.

By investing in the education and capacitybuilding of local volunteers, the clinic is fostering a sense of ownership and self-reliance within the community, which is crucial for sustainable poverty alleviation.

COMMUNITY HOME-BASED CARE PROGRAMS:

- The clinic recognizes that some individuals in the community may face barriers to accessing the clinic's facilities, such as lack of transportation, physical disabilities, or social isolation.
- To address this, the clinic has employed a Community Home Based Care Personnel who engages in home visits while providing a wide range of health
- These services include basic medical care, chronic disease management, maternal and child health support, and social assistance.
- The home-based care personnel work closely with the patients and their families to understand their needs and provide tailored support.
- By delivering essential healthcare and social services directly to people's homes, the clinic is ensuring that even the most vulnerable members of the community can access the care they need.
