SA's 2024 VNR Report acknowledges:

Historic reliance on few critical sectors in country's economy: gold, diamond + coal mining, agriculture + farming;

- This exposes SA to external shocks (eg gold + commodity price fluctuations);
- BUT Govt is committed to diversify economy, incorporating small and medium enterprises;

Persistent high unemployment

(32.9% in 1st quarter 2024, 59.7% of youth between ages15 and 24).

THE 2024 VNR REPORT FROM SA also **ACKNOWLEDGES**: Impact of Covid19 pandemic. The impact of different prevailing political (resulting in violence); ideologies Widespread corruption, political patronage, and ineffective state-owned operations (e.g. transport, water + electricity supply, Localization of the SDGs.

CHALLENGES:

- Persistent socio-economic inequalities;
- Skills mismatch between education and industry;
- Infrastructure inefficiencies;
- Slow uptake on sustainable practices;
- Increase in violent crime especially violence against women and children;
- Rising electricity costs;
- Parallel public and private health systems...
- Commitment to renewable energy and reduction of carbon emissions.

Need for information, recommendations, plans to be accessible to people on the ground including

Engagement with social media

- In the FIVE mechanisms proposed in the report, TWO of which addressed SDG 13, no reference to the need for popular education.
 - In the recent political elections, numerous political parties, old and new, contested for votes BUT

NONE of the election manifestos referred to urgency to address climate change for the sake of the planet's future.

Recommendations continued:

Report addresses the reduction of fuel powered vehicles.

Much of SA's daily transport uses KOMBI Taxis, contributing to carbon emission. Government subsidies needed to transform to electricpowered vehicles - 5-year plan needed...

BEGIN NOW.

• SA a 'dumping ground for combustion engine cars that wouldn't pass emission tests in Europe'. Stricter controls to be put in place to monitor 'aged' vehicles in use in SA to radically decrease our carbon footprint.


Cost of hybrid/ electric cars in SA puts them out of reach... negotiation with the motor industry needed... public – private partnerships!

Recommendations continued:

- Information about Climate change, our carbon footprints etc, to become major feature in education programmes at all levels.
- Popular education NOT ADDRESSED in SA SDG report 2024.
