

ACTIONS 2025-2026

1. Ongoing training and content creation

- Online continuing education course on justice, sustainability, and the Social Doctrine of the Church.
- Thematic webinars with expert guests in key areas (SDGs, migration, climate justice, etc.).
- Round tables with a territorial and thematic focus (e.g., migration, human rights, indigenous peoples).
- Local workshops for training and awareness-raising at the grassroots level.
- Local or national meetings and workshops, in person or virtual, as spaces for practical coordination.
- Content for the website (articles, resources, testimonials, guides, downloadable materials).
- Global Hour: a synchronous virtual space for reflection, prayer, and international coordination.

2. Creative communication and cultural production

- Development of material that enriches the UN proposal with a spiritual, community, and rights-based perspective.
- Photo exhibitions that tell stories of resistance, hope, and transformation.
- Educational comics and video games with a focus on the SDGs and social/environmental justice, aimed especially at young people.

- Personalized messages for specific audiences (young people, religious leaders, community leaders, social media).
- Creation of materials for workshop participants, such as follow-up kits or symbolic credentials.

3. Networks, alliances, and coordination

- Virtual meetings of regional leaders for follow-up and ongoing planning.
- JCoR network in Latin America and the Caribbean: consolidation and revitalization.
- Strategic alliances with religious, ecclesial, civil, and social organizations.
- Redefining the relationship with CLAR, including the co-organization of training events.
- Strengthening of ties with CELAM on issues of advocacy, formation, and synodality.
- Positioning of the JCoR within the Latin American Church as an ecclesial actor with a voice and a proposal.

4. Key actors for coordination

- Youth ministry networks as spaces for animation, action, and advocacy.
- Religious men and women of new generations, protagonists of new ways of living and proclaiming evangelical justice.
- Social, educational, and popular organizations aligned with the values of the JCoR.
- Leaders who participated in previous workshops, integrating them as multipliers and animators in their contexts.
